A career as a 9-1-1 Police Dispatcher can be very rewarding and exciting. The job can be challenging and the environment is fast paced. It requires skill and mental dexterity. Every day is different and every call is unique. 9-1-1 Police Dispatchers are trained to take control of the call, while remaining calm, talking people through some tense and fear-stricken moments. It is a significant responsibility that commands respect, both by those who perform it, and by the police officers who trust and depend on your specific skills and abilities.

When you take a difficult call, your team is there to support and guide you. The RCMP also provides further support to employees should they request it.

The Lifestyle of a Shift Worker

A 9-1-1 Police Dispatcher is a shift worker, which means:

- Your rotating schedule will allow you to have up to four days off in a row.
- Shift work is not a normal weekday schedule, which allows you to go shopping or schedule medical appointments on your days off.
- Shift work will also allow you to spend more time with your family during the week.
- Working nights has a different atmosphere. The types of calls are generally of a different nature than during the day.

The 9-1-1 Police Dispatcher Role

The CAREER

As the "first" of the first responders, 9-1-1 Police Dispatchers serve as the critical link between citizens and the emergency help they require.

9-1-1 Police Dispatchers receive and process emergency and non-emergency calls from the public. Their role is to quickly prioritize and accurately process calls to ensure police and public safety, resulting in safer communities.

Call Takers

Call Takers are trained to accurately instruct the caller as to what they should do in any given situation.

They must quickly and accurately obtain all the required information calls so that an appropriate level of response can be provided as soon as possible.

As a Call Taker, it is your responsibility to obtain all relevant information as soon as possible from the caller, such as:

- Where is it happening?
- What is happening?
- When did it occur?
- Who is involved?
- Are there weapons?
- Are drugs and alcohol involved?
- What is the subject's description?
- What direction are they going?
- Is the person on foot or in a car?
- What is the vehicle description?

Dispatchers

Dispatchers operate like an orchestra conductor responding to calls, coordinating police officers, and finding help where and when it is needed.

Police Officers come to rely on the Dispatcher to ensure they have all the relevant, accurate and timely information to keep themselves and the public safe.

Dispatchers have to know and understand the police officer's role and be able to anticipate the next move — what will the police officers need next and who else needs to be there to support them, such as the Police Service Dogs, Air Services, or Negotiators.

Quick-thinking is a must for potentially life-saving scenarios. It takes an impressive amount of mental clarity, dexterity and laser-sharp focus to do this job.

Employee Wellbeing

The RCMP recognizes how important it is to look after the health and safety of all its employees and provides support.

9-1-1 Police Dispatchers are not immune to psychological health problems and are perhaps more at risk working in a police environment. It's a reality, throughout a Dispatcher's career that they will hear things and deal with situations that most of us never want to experience.

1. Road to Mental Readiness

Mandatory RCMP training to develop a better understanding mental health issues.

2. Peer to Peer

Creates a single source of contact to link employees to the support they need whether it is a work related or a personal issue.


3. Critical Incident Debriefing

A debriefing is offered to an employee exposed or involved in a psychologically traumatic incident that has sufficient emotional power to cause that person to experience a strong or overwhelming reaction and which may inhibit a return to normal duties or lifestyle.

4. Employee Assistance Services Health Canada's program provides confidential counselling for employees and their families.

5. Most treatments are covered by Health Care Benefits.

Behavioural

- Strong communication skills during high pressure situations and the ability to deal with a diversity of people during challenging situations.
- Strong motivation to make a vital contribution to the communities we serve.
- Demonstrate self control and composure during stressful situations and have the ability to be resilient.
- Demonstrate effective decisionmaking skills and are able to quickly and accurately complete multiple tasks under pressure.

Technical

- Excellent computer software skills.
- Type quickly and accurately.
 The minimum typing standard is 40 words per minute with a 95% accuracy rate.

9-1-1 Police Dispatcher **Success Profile**

The 9-1-1 Police Dispatcher role is unique and challenging. While not everyone is suited for this career, those who are a good fit with these eight competencies invariably do well and love what they do.

1. Developing Self

Recognizes personal strengths and learning needs and engages in self-development opportunities to achieve full potential in current and future roles.

2. Flexibility

Considers, adopts and changes behaviours in light of new ideas or work methods, and works effectively within a variety of situations and with various individuals or groups of diverse backgrounds and experiences. Demonstrates a positive attitude and open-mindedness when faced with change.

3. Conscientiousness and Reliability

Fulfills commitments in a professional, thorough and consistent

manner through self-discipline and a sense of duty. Shows a strong attention to detail and a focus on quality.

4. Meeting Client Needs

Shows a strong client service orientation. Balances the needs and expectations of clients with a view to meeting or exceeding them where possible.

5. Communication

Effectively receives and conveys ideas and information in all its forms (verbal, written and non-verbal) in a way that increases the understanding of the target audience.

6. Teamwork

Achieves common goals by working cooperatively with others and developing a positive work climate.

7. Self-Control and Composure

Keeps emotions under control and restrains negative actions when provoked, when faced with opposition or hostility from others, or when working under conditions of increasing levels of stress. Maintains stamina and concentration under continuing stress.

8. Problem Solving

Systematically analyses and breaks down problems, risks, opportunities and issues into component parts, identifies appropriate solutions and takes timely actions and decisions.

Prerequisites

If you are applying to a 9-1-1 Police Dispatch Centre in Courtenay, Kelowna or Prince George, you must have:

- Canadian citizenship or permanent resident status in Canada
- Resided (been physically present) in Canada for the last 5 years. (Applicants may be considered if they have 4 years of residency.)

If you are applying to the 9-1-1 Police Dispatch Centre in Surrey, you must have:

- Canadian citizenship
- Resided (been physically present) in Canada for the last 10 years. (Applicants may be considered if they have 9 years of residency.)

In addition, you must:

- Possesses a Canadian secondary school (high school) diploma or a satisfactory score on the General Competency Test: Level 1 (GCT 1-207)
- Be proficient in English



Where We Work

9-1-1 Police Dispatchers provide 24-hour emergency call-taking and dispatching services for the BC RCMP and work closely with Fire Departments, BC Ambulance Service, and other first responder agencies, such as Search and Rescue.


A Career with Mobility

Training

Once hired as an employee, it is our mission to provide you with all of the knowledge and skills to become a proficient and confident 9-1-1 Police Dispatcher. You will receive a salary and benefits while participating in the training program.

The RCMP's 9-1-1 Police Dispatcher Training Program consists of two parts:

Part 1 Call Taking Training
Part 2 Dispatch Training

Once you successfully complete the training program, you will be promoted to a 9-1-1 Police Dispatcher position. Successful completion of the 9-1-1 Police Dispatcher Training Program can take anywhere from 9 months to a year and occurs only after successful completion of the integration of call-taking and dispatching skills.

- > Application Package must include Application Form, Cover Letter and Resume.
- > Timeline: 2-5 days for review.
- > Applicants meeting the screening requirements will be invited to the next step.

9 Skill Testing



- > Take the CritiCall Exam.
- > The **CritiCall Exam** is an electronic entrance exam that reflects the actual duties performed by 9-1-1 Police Dispatchers.
- > Timeline: 1-2 weeks to complete.

Compensation Package

Pay

When you start your training as a 9-1-1 Police Dispatcher, your annual salary will be \$64,265. You will also receive additional compensation for working shift work.

Upon successful completion of the nine-month 9-1-1 Police Dispatcher Training Program, you will be promoted to a 9-1-1- Police Dispatcher (TCO-O2).

Your annual salary will increase to \$72,282. You will further enjoy four annual pay increments increasing your salary up to \$87,946 after five years of service.

Benefits

The Public Service group insurance benefit plans provide you with peace of mind today and for years to come. As a 9-1-1 Police Dispatcher, you will be provided with the following benefits:

- Public Service Dental Care Plan
- Public Service Health Care Plan
- Public Service Pension Plan
- Disability Insurance

In addition, you will start with three weeks of paid vacation time, earn sick leave credits every month, receive up to two personal leave days a year, up to five paid days per year to take care of your immediate family and so much more. - > Timeline: 2-3 weeks to complete.

5 Security & Medical Assessments



- Complete and submit Security & Medical Assessment forms and documents.
- > Security investigations check and interviews are performed. Hearing & psychological assessment are completed.
- > Timeline: 2-3 months to complete.
- > Qualified Applicants are hired to participate in the training program.
